Selecting fields of distinction should be based on the competitive advantage each possesses, while also monitoring the relationship of our higher education system with its counterparts in the Arab region and globally.

Accredited Courses System Graduate Studies Regulations Rules Helwan University

Article of Faculty

General Rules

First: Rules

Article (1): Academic Degrees

Helwan University awards the following certificates and degrees based on the proposal of the Faculty of Arts Council:

- 1- Postgraduate Diploma in Arts or Languages, according to the specializations of the various academic departments at the faculty.
- 2- A master's degree in literature or languages, according to the specializations of the various academic departments at the faculty.
- 3- A doctorate in philosophy in literature or languages, according to the specializations of the various academic departments at the faculty.

Article (2): Accredited and hours Study Semesters

- 1- The University Council determines the beginning and end of the academic semesters and the application and registration dates for each academic year.
- 2- The basic semester is the period extending between the start of the study and its end, including the examination period. The duration of the semester ranges between 15-17 weeks. The academic year consists of two basic semesters. After the approval of the University Council, based on the proposal of the College Council, it is permissible to offer academic courses in a summer semester in accordance with the rules and conditions determined by the University Council. College Council.
- 3- A credit hour is an academic unit awarded to a student upon successful completion of a course. It represents a student's achievement rate based on academic efforts, both in and outside of class. The approved hour shall be the basis for determining the student's academic load in each semester in accordance with the provisions of these regulations. The relevant academic department shall determine the number of approved hours for each academic course. The regulations shall also regulate the number of approved hours required to be passed as basic requirements for obtaining each academic degree.
- 4- The College Council may, after taking the opinion of the relevant department council and according to the nature of the academic courses, decide to teach one or more courses using the hybrid learning model, whereby the study in the course is 50% to 60% face-to-face and 40% to 50% via the distance learning system, or any other ratio, and this must be presented to the University Council of Graduate Studies for approval and submission. To the University Council for approval.

Article (3): Study Load

The study load is the number of approved hours that a student is allowed to register for during a single semester. A minimum and maximum study load are determined for each grade in accordance with the provisions of these regulations.

Article (4): Registration

Students shall register in the courses of their choice, approved by the academic advisor, within the limits of the academic schedules announced the week prior to the start of classes, and in accordance with the rules and procedures regulating the registration process determined by the College Council. The number of students shall also be determined according to the capabilities of each academic department.

Article (5): Points and Grades for Success in Academic Courses

- 1- The student's performance in the courses and in the overall assessment according to the following grading scale:

- 2- The total course points are calculated based on multiplying the number of points the student obtains by the number of credit hours for the course, to the nearest two decimal places.
- 3- The semester GPA is the average of the student's total points in the semester. It is calculated by dividing the total points for the courses registered in the semester by the total number of credit hours for the courses registered in the semester, to the nearest two decimal places, according to the following mathematical equation:

$$\text{Semester GPA} = \frac{\text{Total points for all courses registered in the semester}}{\text{Total number of credit hours registered in Semester}}$$

$$\text{Total number of credit hours registered in Semester}$$

- 4- The cumulative GPA is the average of the points earned by the student from the total number of courses registered during the academic periods prior to calculating the GPA. It is calculated based on the total points of all courses registered during the academic periods prior to calculating the GPA, divided by the total number of credit hours registered during the periods prior to calculating the GPA, rounded to the nearest two decimal places. According to the following mathematical equation:

$$\text{Cumulative GPA} = \frac{\text{Total points for all courses registered in previous periods}}{\text{Total number of credit hours registered in previous periods}}$$

- 5- 40% of the total grade for each course is allocated to semester work, and 60% is allocated to the final exam. The department council determines the rules governing semester work for all courses based on proposals from faculty members. In the case of courses that do not have a written exam, seminars, or research halls, the entire total grade is allocated to oral discussions and semester work.
- 6- The duration of the final written exam for a single course is determined according to the course teaching hours.
- 7- The College Council may, after taking the opinion of the relevant department council and according to the nature of the academic courses, decide to hold the examination electronically in one or more courses. It may also hold the examination in the entire course or part of it in a manner that allows for electronic correction. This must be presented to the University Graduate Studies Council for approval and submission to the University Council for adoption.

Article (6): Warning and Dismissal from the Faculty

A student will be warned and placed on the warning list if he or she does not achieve the cumulative grade point average specified for each academic degree, in accordance with the provisions of these regulations, at the end of each semester.

- 1- The student must cancel the first warning within a maximum period of one semester following the warning by improving his cumulative GPA to the level required for the academic degree for which he is registered, in accordance with the provisions of these regulations.
- 2- The student who receives two consecutive warnings from the college for raising his cumulative GPA to the level required for the academic degree for which he is registered, in accordance with the provisions of these regulations, will be dismissed.
- 3- The student who has successfully completed 75% of the number of credit hours stipulated in his study plan according to the provisions of these regulations is exempt from this. In this case, the student is granted an exceptional opportunity for a period of one academic semester, with the approval of the College Council.
- 4- A student who does not complete the requirements for obtaining the academic degree for which he is registered shall be dismissed if he exceeds the period specified for obtaining the degree in accordance with the provisions of these regulations.

Article (7): Re-enrollment

A student whose enrollment was cancelled for one of the reasons mentioned in the previous article may re-enroll in accordance with the rules approved by the Council of Graduate Studies and the University Council, provided that this occurs within the period specified for obtaining the degree in accordance with the provisions of these regulations.

Article (8): Attendance

1. A student will be denied the right to attend the final exam for a course if his/her absence rate exceeds 25% of the course's lectures and practical in a single semester without an acceptable excuse. He/she will be considered to have failed the course and will receive an F (failed).

2. A student will be given an absence warning if his/her absence rate exceeds 15% of the course's approved hours.

3. If a student is absent for more than 25% of the approved hours for any course and the absence is due to a compelling reason accepted by the College Council, he will be considered to have withdrawn from that course and it will be recorded in his record that he has withdrawn with an excuse, and the grade for that course will not be counted in his academic record.

Article (9): Failure and Repeating Courses

When a student fails a course, he must repeat it and take the exam once if it is a core course. However, if it is an elective course, the student may repeat it and take the exam once or replace it with another elective course once. The result of the failure in that course will be recorded in his academic record.

Article (10): Academic Guidance

Each academic department shall appoint an academic advisor for each specialization at the beginning of each semester from among the faculty members within the department. The academic advisor shall assume the duties of academic guidance for diploma students throughout their entire study period, and for master's and doctoral students prior to thesis registration. The thesis supervisor acts as an academic advisor for students registered for a master's or doctoral thesis.

Article (11): Withdrawal, Enrollment and Addition Re-Enrollment

- 1- A student is permitted to withdraw from one or more courses during the first and second weeks of the semester. In this case, the student's record will not show that he or she has withdrawn.
- 2- The student is allowed to add one or more courses during the first and second weeks of the semester, taking into account the maximum permitted study load in accordance with the provisions of these regulations.
- 3- If the student has met the attendance rate of 75% of lectures and applications, and after the approval of the College Council, he may withdraw from one or more courses during the first six weeks of the semester. In this case, a "W" will be recorded on his record, and these courses will not be included in the student's grade.
- 4- If a student meets the attendance rate stipulated in these regulations, which is 75% of lectures and applications, he may withdraw completely from studies in one of the semesters if he presents an excuse acceptable to the University Graduate Studies Council based on a proposal from the College Council. In this case, it will be recorded in his record that he has withdrawn with an acceptable excuse (CW) for all courses of the semester. In this case, withdrawal shall be considered a suspension of registration for one semester.
- 5- Considering the provisions of the previous paragraph, the College Council may suspend a student's registration if he/she presents an acceptable excuse. In this case, the suspension period shall not be counted within the period prescribed for obtaining the degree in accordance with the provisions of these regulations.

Article (12): Dropout from the Faculty

A student is considered to have dropped out of school if he/she does not register for a semester or if he/she withdraws from all the courses registered for in a semester without an acceptable excuse. In this case, the period of absence from school is counted within the period required to obtain the degree in accordance with the provisions of these regulations.

Article (13): Postponement the Final Exam

The final exam may be postponed as an exception if the student has unavoidable circumstances, subject to the following conditions:

1. The student's absence from the exam must be due to an excuse acceptable to the College Council.
2. The student must take the exam no later than the end of the second week of the beginning of the semester following the semester in which the final exam was postponed; otherwise, he/she will be considered to have failed the course.
3. The student must meet the attendance rate stipulated in these regulations (75% of the course's approved hours).
4. The student must complete the course's semester work. In this case, the student's grade in the postponed course will be recorded as an Incomplete (I) exam. After taking the exam, the (I) grade will be replaced with the actual grade he receives.

Second: Postgraduate Diplomas in Faculty of Arts

Article (14): Registration Conditions

The following conditions must be met for a student to enrol in any postgraduate diploma in arts:

The student must have a bachelor's degree in arts from one of the accredited Egyptian universities or an equivalent degree from a scientific institute recognized by the university. Students who have obtained a bachelor's degree from other faculties may be accepted. Others in any of these diplomas, based on a proposal from the relevant academic department council and the approval of the college council. The college council, based on a proposal from the department council, may decide to impose additional supplementary courses on these students.

- The college council determines the number of students accepted annually in each of these diplomas after consulting the relevant department councils.
- Any other conditions set by the College Council for comparison between applicants for selection based on the required numbers.

The applicant must submit the documents approved by the university.

For international students, their admission is subject to the rules established by the University Council.

Article (15): Requirements of Acquisition Postgraduate Diploma Studies

To obtain a Postgraduate Diploma in the specialization, a student must:

1. Successfully complete (30) credit hours, including (21) credit hours of compulsory requirements and (9) credit hours of elective requirements, according to the study plan prepared by each academic department in accordance with the provisions of these regulations.
2. The student must achieve a cumulative average of no less than (2) (c). He must also pass all courses successfully and achieve an average of no less than (2) (c) in each course separately.

Article (16): Duration of Study and Study Load

1. The minimum period required to obtain a postgraduate diploma in arts is two academic semesters, and the maximum period is four basic academic semesters, except in cases decided by the College Council, in which the student may be given an exceptional opportunity for one additional academic semester.
2. The minimum study load for a postgraduate diploma at the university per semester is (9) credit hours, and the maximum is (18) credit hours. Students who have less than three courses remaining before graduation are exempt from this limit.

Article (17): Adding New Diplomas

The College Council has the right to add new diplomas in other specializations.

Article (18): Study Plan

The following tables show the academic courses taught in each diploma and the number of credit hours for each course. The College Council approves the academic description of the academic courses at the beginning of each academic year based on a proposal from the academic departments.

Third: Master's degree

Article (19): Registration Conditions

The following conditions must be met for a student to be admitted to a master's degree:

- 1- He must have a Bachelor of Arts degree in any of the majors offered by the college with a grade of "Good" or higher from one of the universities of the Arab Republic of Egypt, or an equivalent degree from the Supreme Council of Universities and recognized by Helwan University, or he must have a diploma in Specialization with a grade of no less than "Very Good."
- 2- The applicant must meet the university-approved requirements.
- 3- Achieve the foreign language proficiency level determined by the university's Graduate Studies Council, except for language departments, where the department's council determines the required level and foreign language. Pass the proficiency course in writing university theses in Arabic, as determined by the university's Graduate Studies Council.
- 4- For international students, their admission is subject to the rules approved by the University Council.

Article (20): Requirements for Obtaining master's degree

The requirements for obtaining a Master's degree are (45) credit hours according to the study plan prepared by each academic department in accordance with the provisions of these regulations. These requirements are distributed as follows:

- 1- Study of academic courses equivalent to (24) credit hours, of which (15) credit hours Compulsory requirements and (9) credit hours of elective requirements. Successful completion of these courses requires achieving a minimum grade of (C+) in each course, and a cumulative grade point average of (C+).
- 2- The year's work and semester exams represent 40% of the total grade, and 60% for the final exam, with the total grade being 100.
- 3- The student must submit a plan. Research on a topic approved by the College Council based on a proposal from the relevant academic department council, for a total of (21) credit hours. The research must be new and innovative, and the minimum number of words must be 40,000 words.

- 4- The thesis defence must be successfully completed in accordance with the rules set forth in the Universities Regulation Law No. (49) of 1972, its amendments, and its executive regulations.

Article (21): Duration of Study and Study Load

- 1- The minimum required to obtain a master's degree is four basic semesters, and the maximum is eight basic semesters, unless the College Council, upon the proposal of the Department Council, decides to maintain enrollment for two years based on the report submitted by the supervisors.
- 2- The student may register for a thesis. Master's degree after two full semesters have passed from the date of registration for the Master's degree, provided that the student is not on the warning list and that he has successfully completed at least (21) credit hours. The thesis may not be submitted for discussion and judgment except after two full semesters have passed from the date of the College Council's approval of the thesis's registration.
- 3- The thesis will be deleted. The student is registered for a master's degree if he does not apply to register for a master's thesis after three years have passed from the date of his registration. In this case, the student may be granted a general diploma in the specialization, if he has successfully completed all the required courses to obtain a master's degree, if he achieves a cumulative grade point average of (C) in all requirements.
- 4- The minimum study load in one semester is (9) credit hours, and the maximum is (12) credit hours.

Article (22): Academic Plan

The following tables show the courses taught in the master's degree and the number of credit hours for each course. The College Council approves the academic description of the courses at the beginning of each academic year, based on a proposal from the scientific departments.

Fourth: Doctorate in Philosophy in Arts

Article (23): Admission Restrictions

To be eligible for admission to the Doctor of Philosophy in Arts program in the specialization branch, a student must have a master's degree in the specialization branch from one of the universities of the Arab Republic of Egypt or an equivalent degree recognized by the Supreme Council of Universities and recognized by the university.

Article (24): Requirements for Obtaining a Doctor of Arts Degree

The requirements for obtaining a doctorate degree are (50) credit hours according to the study plan prepared by each academic department in accordance with the provisions of these regulations. These requirements are distributed as follows:

- 1- Studying academic courses equivalent to (18) credit hours, successfully passing these courses, achieving a grade point average of no less than 2.33 (C+) in each course, and achieving a cumulative grade point average of no less than (C+) GPA less than 2.33
9 credit hours "Required"- 9 credit hours "Selective"
- 2- 2. Passing the comprehensive doctoral examination with a minimum grade of 2.33 (C+) in each examination area. The University Council determines the rules for forming the comprehensive examination committees, their areas, and their meeting dates based on the proposal of the Faculty Council after taking the opinion of the relevant academic department council. 70% of the total grade is allocated to the written examination and 30% to the oral examination. To take the comprehensive doctoral exam, the student must have successfully completed all compulsory and elective courses.
- 3- The year's work and semester exams represent 40% of the total grade, and the final exam represents 60%, with the total grade being 100.
- 4- -4 The student must submit a research plan on a topic approved by the College Council based on a proposal from the relevant academic department council, for a total of (32) credit hours. The research must be new and innovative, and the minimum number of words must not be less than 50,000 words.
- 5- The thesis defense must be successfully completed in accordance with the rules stipulated by the Universities Regulation Law No. (49) of 1972, its amendments, and its executive regulations.
- 6- The student must achieve the foreign language level as determined by the University's Graduate Studies Council and must pass the proficiency course in writing university theses in Arabic as determined by the University's Graduate Studies Council.

Article (25): Study duration and study load

- 1- The minimum required to obtain a doctorate degree is seven core semesters, and the maximum is twelve core semesters, unless the Faculty Council, based on the proposal of the Department Council, decides to maintain enrollment for a period of one year based on a report submitted by the supervisors. Enrollment may be suspended in accordance with the rules set by the University Graduate Studies Council.

- 2- No student may submit a request to register for a doctoral thesis only after three academic semesters have passed from the date of his registration for the doctoral degree, if the student is not on the warning list and has successfully passed all compulsory and elective courses. The thesis may not be submitted for discussion and evaluation until four basic academic semesters have passed from the date of the College Council's approval. Thesis Registration.
- 3- A student's registration for a doctoral degree will be dropped if he or she fails to register for the doctoral thesis after eight basic semesters have passed from the date of registration.
- 4- The minimum study load per semester is six credit hours, and the maximum is nine credit hours.

Article (26): Academic Plan
