

**Dr. Michael Medhat Yousif** is a Lecturer in Modern and Contemporary Philosophy at the University of Helwan.

He received his PhD in Philosophy from the University of Helwan in 2016. His doctoral thesis “The problematic of evolution in Daniel Dennett’s philosophy of mind” examined the intersections between the theory of evolution and philosophy of mind as depicted in the works of American philosopher Daniel Dennett.

Dr. Yousif also holds an MA in contemporary American philosophy from the University of Helwan. His MA thesis “The problematic of the Future of Philosophy in Postmodern Thought: Richard Rorty as a Model” explored the possible alternative futures of professional philosophy from Richard Rorty’s postmodern perspective.

His interests and research explore themes of American philosophy, Analytical Philosophy, Postmodernism, Evolutionary Philosophy, Philosophy of Mind, Political Philosophy, and Moral Philosophy.

In addition to his academic work, Dr. Michael is a distinguished translator in the field of modern and contemporary philosophy. Among his notable translations is "The Morals of Modernity" by Charles Taylor, and “"Steps Toward a Unified Foundation for Scientific Models and Methods" by Inge Helland”, published in ٢٠٢٢ by the National Translation Project in Egypt.

He has published in several academic journals focusing on topics such as personal identity, feminism, and moral philosophy.

At Helwan University, Dr. Yousif teaches courses on Modern Western Philosophy, Contemporary Western Philosophy, Modern German Philosophy, and Philosophy of Civilization.

His teaching style emphasizes conceptual clarity, historical context, and student-led inquiry.

He is fluent in Arabic and English and engages directly with philosophical texts in their original languages.

He also supervises MA and PhD students on topics in Modern Western Philosophy, Moral and Political Philosophy, and Philosophy of Mind.
